Developing a Program of Renewal and Rejuvenation

Dear Church Family,

Our sabbatical task force has been hard at work on our congregation's application for up to \$50,000 in sabbatical grant money with up to \$15,000 of this going toward the congregation's expenses. This Sunday during our congregational meeting we will be considering a proposal from the task force on what our congregation might do while I am gone for three months in the late spring and early summer of 2013. To give you a sense of what they are crafting, I am sharing with you an adapted portion of a drafted proposal:

Rather than just "fill the pulpit" while our pastor is gone for his sabbatical, we realized that both the congregation and our pastor could have a time of resurrection, renewal, and recharging during this period. One thing that inspired our congregation during our first capital campaign was the restoration of the sweeping skylight along our roofline that is covered on the inside by stained glass. Warren Weber, the architect that designed our church, designed four other churches in our conference that have similar sweeping rooflines that result in spacious sanctuaries that draw the worshipers' attention upward. As part of our renewal celebration, we propose visiting these other Weber-designed churches and engaging in fellowship with them.

Other activities such dramatic performances are also being considered. If you have feedback, please contact John Fite. For all their work, I encourage you to thank our task force: Karen Kulm, Pam Osborne, Nancy Olmstead, Richard Trefren, and John Fite.

Kathryn, John and Joe want to thank all of you for your warmth and acceptance. But they never did find a good fit (although they had not tried the UCC church before). With this church they found a wonderful combination of tradition, inclusivity, social justice, openness and a bunch of really nice and very smart people. In addition, Brooks is pretty good with his sermons. From the first week they attended over a year ago, they were impressed. But they wanted to take their time and they did. They sincerely appreciate your welcoming them into the congregation.

Most of you know Kathryn from her music. She has enjoyed substituting for Christopher as music has been a big part of her life. Kathryn has been playing in church since she was 13, earning a Bachelor's degree in Music along with her Masters in Religion and a Masters in Education.
