Dear Church Family,

About a month ago, Eunita and I made a delightful discovery: our dog Joey makes Danalyn laugh—uncontrollably so. When Joey pounces on a toy, shakes a stuffed animal in his mouth, or chases his tail—these are all occasions for bursts of guttural guffaws. As you might expect, Danalyn's entertainment makes for our entertainment. An additional benefit is that Joey has also proven himself to be a good distraction amid bouts of fussing and crying—Danalyn's that is. When all else fails, I try Joey, and the results are almost always good.

I asked Eunita why she thinks Joey inspires Danalyn's laughter, and I am in agreement with her assessment. Through the eyes of Danalyn, Joey is full of the unexpected. His antics are unpredictable. He is the unwitting clown of our household. I was recently reminded of Joey's role in our family while reading a reflection on the Easter season that extends to Pentecost. The Easter season is a time to celebrate the unexpected and unpredictable even when the world thinks you are a fool. When one reads the headlines of violence in Middle East or in our own communities, it might seem foolish to hold out any hope for peace. Yet Easter ushers in a faith that unsettles notions of fixed realities. It allows us to think that the impossible might still be possible.

In our house, Joey is our Easter Doggie. Even when we might want to fuss with unhappiness, he keeps us on our toes with a gladness in our hearts.

=Marriage Equality Update=

You may remember that little 116 mile walk we took in February to support the Marriage Equality bill. We were all thrilled when it passed with bi-partisan support and Governor Gregoire signed it on February 13th; however, opponents of marriage equality are working to stop the bill from becoming law. They have until June 6th to file their referendum and they must have 120,577 valid registered voter signatures to put marriage equality up for vote in the November election. What can you do to help protect marriage equality.

Take the pledge to support Marriage Equality!

Advocacy organizations, faith organizations, elected officials, and citizens across Washington will be joining Washington United for Marriage in their month-long sprint to show the state, the nation, and our opponents that the people of Washington support marriage equality. Washington United for Marriage has 53,875 pledge signers so far, and that's a good start. But to keep up with our opponents, we need 66,702 more. Take the pledge at:

<u>http://washingtonunitedformarriage.org/</u>. If you don't have computer access, you can sign a pledge card on the table in the narthex and turn the card into the office, preferably by May 20th.

Remember, in WA State, a referendum to the people asks if a law already passed by the legislature should be approved or rejected, so if Referendum 74 makes it onto the November ballot, <u>approving it will keep the</u> <u>Marriage Equality law intact</u>. This is the text of the referendum as it would appear on the ballot:

The legislature passed Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6239 concerning marriage for same-sex couples, modified domestic-partnership law, and religious freedom, and voters have filed a sufficient referendum petition on this bill. This bill would allow same-sex couples to marry, preserve domestic partnerships only for seniors, and preserve the right of clergy or religious organizations to refuse to perform, recognize, or accommodate any marriage ceremony.
