Our Church and Marriage Equality

Dear Church Family,

For the third time this year, our church was featured in print and television news stories last week. In this most recent set of stories, our marriage equality yard signs made us newsworthy. While what is most important is that people know there are Christians who support marriage equality and are willing to bear public witness as a result of their values, a potential side benefit of the signs is more visitors to our church. Despite this, a few may have concerns about our recent public advocacy.

Some may be in favor of marriage equality but nevertheless question whether we are spending "too much time on a single issue." While I would agree that there are many worthwhile causes that deserve our attention and concern, I also believe that there are good reasons for why we should be particularly active on the issue of marriage equality. The first is that there is a *unique need* for Christian witness in support of marriage equality. Opposition to marriage equality has been waged primarily by Christians in the name of Christianity. The media has generally encouraged this view, and as a result, many in our society equate opposition with the Christian faith. Some are not even aware that Christians can think and act differently. These people need to know we exist, and they need to know why we believe what we believe. If churches like ours don't stand up and speak out, then Christianity as a whole may well deserve blame for the denial of rights to LGBT persons.

A second reason for our continued activism on marriage equality is that we are in a *unique historical moment*. Over the course of history, there are periods in which conditions make it possible for movements to arise and win substantial changes. This was the case with the civil rights movement and the women's rights movement, and I believe it is now the case with the marriage equality movement.

A third reason is that for the last 20 years we have had a *unique calling* as an open and affirming church. Through congregational meetings and through our on-going ministries, we have collectively discerned that our church has a special calling when it comes to issues of inclusion and equality pertaining to LGBT persons. This calling is part of our core identity as a congregation.

Undoubtedly, we have other callings. While we lacked volunteers this year to continue our focus on children's issues, some of us are beginning to explore ways in which we can address child hunger next fall and winter. In the end, I believe there is no reason for us to place worthy causes in competition with each other. All of it is holy work. All of it is an opportunity to live out our faith.
