A New Spiritual Inspiration

Dear Church Family,

Last week I had a conversation with a Christian who I would characterize as not having an open mind. I could hardly begin to express my own beliefs without it eliciting exasperated condescension. Apparently, I was veering from the Word of God (or at least this person's perception of the Word of God). It quickly became clear that logical argumentation in defense of my views was not going to win the day. It is hard to compete with someone who already feels like they hold the answer to everything.

It can be tempting to respond to self-righteous certainty with an equal dose of self-righteous certainty. I knew this was not the route I wanted to go, but this realization by itself left me feeling rather defeated. How can a Christianity that embraces critical thinking ever compete with the confidence and conviction of the Pure Bible Patriots (PBPs)? It would seem our questioning minds inherently keep us out of the race. On a certain emotional level, we are at best doomed to a second place finish to the PBPs.

I was in the doldrums over this until I considered the example of a true racing champion: my daughter Danalyn. Ever since she began to crawl a month ago, she has been zipping around our house with a fully charged battery. For me, the best part is the expression on her face as she heads toward a destination. The most accurate description I can give is to say that it is a look of excited curiosity.

As I reflected upon this, I realized at once that Danalyn is my new spiritual inspiration. Whereas the PBPs have biblical zeal, I like to think that I have an excited curiosity. I want to explore every room in the house. I want to look under every doormat and peer into every cabinet drawer. There is a whole world waiting for me, and I want to crawl, walk, and run to greet it. This is part of the great joy of my faith, and I would not want it any other way.

Good News for Worker Justice!

Last year during a moment for mission on Sunday morning we heard about the plight of workers at the Vancouver Hilton who were suffering from low wages and poor benefits. Last month we were informed that the workers won a great victory in their new contract. Here are a few of the details: Over the course of two years, they will get a \$1 wage increase. The hotel had previously proposed a pay increase of 27 cents. The minimum number of hours needed for health care eligibility was reduced from 32 hours to 24 hours. House keepers only have to check out 10 rooms in 8 hours rather than the 15 rooms previously required of them. For Christmas and Thanksgiving, they now get double time. Previously, they got nothing extra.

THE MISSION AND OUTREACH FOCUS FOR JULY IS: HEIFER INTERNATIONAL

Imagine giving a person living in poverty the means to earn an income and feed his or her family. That's a huge gift! *Heifer* gifts are also unique because they make funny sounds like "quack, buk-buk or bzzz".

For many people, economic salvation is a pregnant goat; it will breed and provide milk – enough to drink and sell.

Part of the Heifer tradition is "Passing On the Gift." Recipients are expected to pass on the first female offspring of their animal; along with the training they received, to another person in need, helping to share the wealth. Since 1944, more than 4 million families in 120 countries have been given this gift of self-reliance.

More than a million animals have been passed on as gifts by recipients in China. Just \$700 in animals and training can help lift a family out of poverty and on the average, another 6 families are eventually helped by each animal donation through passing on the gift.

Meet Tom and Patty Yates

Two of our newest church members are Tom and Patty Yates.

Tom is a native Washingtonian, born in Spokane and raised in Alderwood Manor, a suburb of Seattle. Tom has had wide professional experience. He joined the Air Force during the Vietnam War after graduating High School and just before the Pueblo crisis. During his Air Force stint, he was stationed at McChord AFB in Tacoma and served as a Chaplain's Assistant.

Patty (Price) Yates was born in Philadelphia, PA. She grew up in Pittsburgh PA. Her family moved to West Los Angeles when she was a junior in high school.

Patty and Tom met in a professional Christian repertory theater company, *The Covenant Players*. By the end of their first year of touring, they liked each other and were married on January 2, 1977. They continued to work for the theater company and established a regional office in Milwaukee, Wisconsin where their first son, Cyrus, was born. They were then transferred to Pittsburgh, PA, where they worked to establish another regional office. Their daughter, Abigail was born in Pennsylvania.

Tom worked for the theater group for 14 years, and Patty was with them for 9 years. At the end of this time, Tom decided to return to college at Cal State Northridge in Los Angeles where he received an undergraduate degree in Theater. He then went to Divinity School in Claremont, California where he earned both his Masters and his Doctorate of Divinity degrees. Patty continued to work as a professional actress while Tom was going to school.

Tom was called to be the pastor at 1st Christian Church in Longview WA where they welcomed their son, Dylan. After six years in Longview, Tom was called to serve at 1st Christian Church here in Vancouver where they've lived since 1993. During Tom's ministry in Longview, Patty was a Theater Major at Lower Columbia Community College. She enjoyed working there and noted that the school had her *favorite director of all time!*

Tom began the transition from pastoring a church to working as a hospital chaplain in Longview. He returned to the military by joining the Army Reserves at Vancouver Barracks where he also joined the Army Reserve Band returning to playing the trombone after an absence of many years. Eventually, Tom became a chaplain in the Army Reserves and served one year of active duty in Afghanistan in 2004 and another year of active duty in Iraq in 2009.

During Tom's leave from Iraq in 2009, Patty was diagnosed with multiple myeloma. Tom remained on active duty with the Army while Patty went through four months of chemotherapy. This was followed by having a full bone marrow transplant. Patty has had a long and slow recovery, but she and Tom have found out during this time just how many friends they have. Patty is now in remission.

Tom retired from the Reserves as a Lieutenant Colonel. He has worked for the past five years as a chaplain at SWWMC, now known as PeaceHealth. Patty is working with a friend to start a women's theater company based in Portland. The vision is to provide more professional opportunities for women and girls to work in theater.

Patty and Tom have 4 adult children. Somehow we missed discussing where their third child Molly was born. My assignment to this congregation is to find out where Molly was born and what is keeping Tom and Patty active.
