## THE MISSION AND OUTREACH FOCUS FOR JULY IS: HEIFER INTERNATIONAL

Imagine giving a person living in poverty the means to earn an income and feed his or her family. That's a huge gift! *Heifer* gifts are also unique because they make funny sounds like "quack, buk-buk or bzzz".

For many people, economic salvation is a pregnant goat; it will breed and provide milk – enough to drink and sell.

Part of the Heifer tradition is "Passing On the Gift." Recipients are expected to pass on the first female offspring of their animal; along with the training they received, to another person in need, helping to share the wealth. Since 1944, more than 4 million families in 120 countries have been given this gift of self-reliance.

More than a million animals have been passed on as gifts by recipients in China. Just \$700 in animals and training can help lift a family out of poverty and on the average, another 6 families are eventually helped by each animal donation through passing on the gift.

# **Capital Campaign 2 Underway**

The second Capital Campaign to pay for the roof and skylight repairs began on June 3, 2012 and will run until the end of May, 2015.

Although we had hoped to reach a \$400,000 goal, we were unable to do that. At the end of the first month we have pledges from 49 families who contributed to the first campaign and nine families new to the church. These pledges total \$236,610. We are hoping to eventually raise at least \$250,000.

In the first month we have raised \$21,327 in pledges and contributions for the new campaign, a very respectable beginning. Four persons have actually completed their entire campaign pledges.

The Property and Finance Ministry and the Council are actively working on how to best use the money we will have come available for covering the monthly mortgage payments, paying down some of the outstanding balance, and paying for costs to projects such as painting the outside of the building, replacing broken heat pumps, etc.

# **Inspiring Ministries**

The most recent issue of the UCC magazine StillSpeaking includes the stories of two inspiring ministries. One story is about a UCC church in Philadelphia that sponsored the creation of a nonprofit organization that blends art and spirituality. Over 25,000 youth have participated in one of its programs over the 10-years it has existed. One of its offerings helps children to "heal and recover from trauma via the power of art." Another inspiring ministry featured in the magazine is that of a LGBT Asylum Support Task Force at Hadwen Park UCC in Worcester, Massachusetts. This ministry assists LGBT persons who have fled other countries due to threats of violence. Often these persons are unable to find support in their own immigrant communities.
