The Meaning of Advent

Dear Church Family,

Whether it is my collection of wood carved Santas, my fondness for gingerbread houses, or my annual trip to see the Christmas lights of Peacock Lane, I have a deep love for all the Christmas joys that December brings. However, I also know there is a distinction between these holiday traditions and Advent. While Advent has its feelings of hope and gladness, it also comes with a longing and a tension. The party has not yet truly begun. We acutely feel that all is not right with the world, and we yearn for God to come into our midst. We feel the contrast between the night that *is* and the light that *ought to be*. We wait for the light. We watch for it. We may even ache for it. This is not the stuff of plum fairies and gingerbread men. This is the stuff of suffering met with prayer.

I mention all of this not because I want more December rain to fall upon the Christmas parade. I mention all of this because I think Advent is what makes the joy of Christmas day real and authentic, deep and profound. With that said, I will not be doing away with any of the traditions that I observe in the days leading up to Christmas. They still have an important place in my life. They bring delight to my family and me. They stir cherished memories. For me, Advent and the Christmas traditions of December are not mutually exclusive. They simply serve different purposes.

While I encourage everyone to continue holiday customs and activities in the month to come, I also invite each of you to make the most of Advent as well. Take note of the wrongs and injustices of the night hour, but, as one writer puts it, also anticipate that "burning fire whose light chases away every shadow, floods every corner, and turns midnight into noon."
