However, the men at the shelter are deeply appreciative of us sharing our time and hospitality with them.

Special Guest Preacher and Adult Ed Presenter

On Sunday, February 24th, we will have special visit from the Rev. Paul Benz of the Faith Action Network (FAN). Paul is one of the organizational directors at FAN, and he will be driving down from Seattle to be with us. He has been instrumental in helping us organize the Fast for the Children. Among his many accomplishments, Paul was honored with an award from the Washington Sustainable Food and Farming Network for his work in getting the "Local Farms Healthy Kids" bill passed and signed into law as one of the first in the nation to establish a Farm to School program that brings locally grown food into the public schools.

Good News for People Age 70 ½ or Older

The American Taxpayer Relief Act of 2012 provides the opportunity to take advantage of the old "IRA Charitable Rollover" which has now been extended through 2012 and 2013. This provision allows a donor to make a tax-free distribution from a traditional IRA or Roth IRA provided that money is transferred to a charitable organization, including your church.

If you wish to transfer a December 2012 IRA withdrawal to a charity, you may still do so, but you must act quickly and ensure the contribution is made by January 31, 2013. If you made a charitable gift from their IRA last year in the hopes that Congress would extend the IRA charitable rollover, you are in luck! Your tax benefit is retroactive to January 1, 2012.
