Grief In The Church By Kaye Kipp

When I was asked to write for the cover of the Link, it occurred to me that grief would be a fitting and timely subject, since we, as individuals and as a church community, have lost several people within the past year who were important in our lives.

We feel a void, remembering the roles these people played, both in our lives and within the functioning of the church. They will be sorely missed. The contributions they made and the impact on the church are a constant reminder that they were an integral part of our church community. They each left an invaluable legacy.

I believe there are as many ways to grieve as there are people. None of us go through the grief process in exactly the same way. Of course, we all feel a deep sense of loss, but our reactions to that loss are unique to each individual, as is the length of time it takes. We all walk our own grief steps, but we can take comfort in the fact that since we are a community, the paths we follow as we go through the grief process parallel in many ways. For example, we all miss people we no longer see in the congregation or in the choir but the loss effects us each differently, depending on the closeness of the relationship. We are drawn together by common memories of those who have left us, yet we each have different memories we treasure in different ways.

I wonder, sometimes, what those who were closest to us would say if they could. I am comforted by the thought that they would say, "I'm not really gone, you know. I am with you whenever you look at a photograph, laugh at a joke I told, thumb through your memories, or carry on a tradition I may have started. I'm still an influence in your life. Grieve for me if you need to, but remember, our physical separation is just a moment in time"

Mission & Outreach June Special Offering TRIPLE POINT YOUTH GROUP

Triple Point is a local youth group for gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, questioning, and straight ally youth, ages 13-21 years old. They provide a safe space, support, education, information and referral services through Children's Home Society of Washington (CHSW.) Triple Point also provides youth with a meal and structured activities during each meeting. The Vancouver chapter currently meets at the CHSW building at 1112 Columbia St, downtown Vancouver, but they are in the process of planning and fundraising for their own building.

Triple Point meets every Tuesday from 3:00 – 6:00pm for Drop-In and the Support Group meets in the evening from 6 p.m.-8 p.m. Volunteers provide a meal for the kids and mentoring. - Go straight through the intersection—you are now on Highway 211
- Drive about 3 miles to Camp Adams, located on the left side of the highway.
- The camp is located between mile markers 18 and 19, ³/₄ mile past marker 18.
