## The Gift of Friendship Karen Owen

The gift of international friendship and understanding is an important part of our church community. I am grateful for the support given to me when I was part of a teacher exchange to the Commonwealth of Independent States (formerly the Soviet Union). Church members continue to be instrumental in a number of exchange programs and efforts. We support projects such as Heifer International. Foreign exchange students are welcomed. We invite representatives of other faiths as speakers.

A burning question many of us ask is: "How might we improve communications and understanding of religious and social views that differ from our own?" In the 2013 book, <a href="Engaging Teachers in Classroom Walkthroughs">Engaging Teachers in Classroom Walkthroughs</a> by Kachur, Stout, and Edwards, I discovered some guidelines for conversation that also apply when discussing differing views: \*Respect, accept, and honor each person. Listen to, welcome, and consider others' ideas. Encourage every voice.

\*Create opportunities for and value humor and fun.

- \*Honor the idea that we are all here to learn and grow together. Look for positive ideas you can take away.
- \*Ask genuine questions that reflect what you wonder about. Do not set up the answer by asking leading questions. Ask "what if" and "I wondered" reflective questions. Ask for clarification if you do not understand.

\*Listen to the perspectives of all. Encourage exchange of ideas.

These guidelines are <u>not</u> easy to follow. With diligence and practice they can become affirmations to help us as we "walkthrough" our spiritual journeys with diverse others.

Dear Church Family,



For those who may be wondering, there were no 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter financial statements issued. Just as Dwight Chapman ended his long tenure as our Financial Secretary there was an update to the software we use to track pledges and contributions which meant additional work to ensure that the statements from the new software would be correct. I am working on making sure the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter statements will accurately reflect each members' giving for the year.

The new software also gives us the option to deliver the financial statements by email instead of having to print and hand them out four times each year. In the coming weeks I will be learning about this new option and may send out a test message to everyone for whom we have an email address on file. This is also a good time to remind everyone about bringing pledges to the annual budget and the capital campaign up to date and to make a contribution to cover the annual per capita expense of \$13 per member.

If you write checks to the church, you can combine contributions to several accounts (annual budget, capital campaign, etc.) on a single check as long as you use the memo line to indicate how much goes to each account. This will save you some time and checks and does not make the accounting any harder at my end.

# Small Spiritual Transformation Groups Starting Up

Pam Osborne will again be leading two small groups at church this year called "Seeking God Together." They are designed to help participants see and recognize the movement of God's Spirit in their day-to-day lives. We will focus this year on spiritual transformation through our desire for God, solitude and silence, Lectio Devina (a way of reading scripture), honoring the body as the temple of the Holy Spirit, the examen or daily review, and the rule of life.
