JUBILEE Special Offering & Action is Sunday, October 20th

Jubilee USA Network is an alliance of churches, labor, environmental, and community organizations. In the late 1990s, people across the map joined together to form the global Jubilee movement to call for debt cancellation for impoverished countries and for just economic policies. From this, Jubilee USA was born. Since then, we have won critical global financial reforms and more than \$130 billion in debt relief for the world's poorest people.

Our church voted to become a Jubilee Congregation several years ago. As part of our commitment, <u>we take an annual offering</u>, educate ourselves on debt issues, and conduct action campaigns.

After church on October 20th we will stand in solidarity with our brothers and sisters around the world by joining hands. Supporters across the country will be sending Jubilee USA pictures of them holding cutout hands declaring why they join in Jubilee. We are using the symbol of the open hand to illustrate our engagement with our global partners on debt cancellation and solidarity with those most affected by debt crises.
