Dear Church Family,

I am delighted to announce two upcoming book events. On Sunday, November 10th at 11:15 am, the Rev. Dr. J. Alfred Smith, Sr., will be joining me for a book signing as we present our book *Sounding the Trumpet: How Churches Can Answer God's Call to Justice*. To accompany our signing, there will be a special homemade treat that involves melted marshmallows. We have had this treat before in our church. Bonus points will be given to anyone who can remember its name. A hint: these cookies will set you aflame in a state of ecstasy.

The meaning for this event is heightened for me because in an extraordinary act of generosity the Leadership Institute of Smith's church has paid for his airfare and his hotel so that he can be with us. I hope all of you can be present to meet a man who Al Sharpton has described as the "Black Pope." He is a person whose words are full of wisdom and hope.

The second book event to which I would like to invite each of you is the inaugural meeting of the Spiritual Growth Audio Book Club. This is a book club for people who don't have time for books! To participate in this book club, you do not have to set aside any extra time in your busy schedule to read. As you drive around town, fold your laundry, and cook in the kitchen, you can listen to an audio book designed to spur your spiritual growth. The only extra thing you will have to do each month is arrive at Little Italy in downtown Vancouver to enjoy dinner while we discuss the book. As you can see, this is a very demanding group.

Each participant will be responsible for acquiring the audio book either at a library, a store, or online. (Of course, you can also get the paperback version of the book instead if you prefer doing books the old fashioned way). Our first book will be arguably one of the most important books ever written for those who describe themselves as progressive Christians. It is Marcus Borg's *The Heart of Christianity: Rediscovering a Life of Faith*. As an audio book, one can complete this book in eight hours. My personal experience is that eight hours of listening is easy to accomplish in a month.




THANKSGIVING FOOD BASKETS

Financial Statements Distributed/Mailed

Year-to-date statements (through the end of September) were distributed after church on Sunday, 10/20/13. The remaining statements will be mailed out on Monday. These statement cover pledges to this year's operating budget, the second Capital Campaign, as well as all other giving you may have made to the church.

There were no second quarter statements because I was just transitioning into my new position and the next statements will be the end-of-year statements covering all of 2013. It is really important to check this third quarter statement against your own records to make sure I have recorded your contributions in the right category and to ensure that everything is listed properly. Please contact me if you discover any discrepancies.

Your statement may have some hand-written updates because your giving for the operating budget was split between two "Pledging for operating" accounts. This happened because of a software update and I will be consolidating these entries before the end-of-year statements are produced.

This is also a good time to remind everyone about bringing pledges to the annual budget and the capital campaign up to date and to make a contribution to cover the annual per capita expense of \$13 per member.

If you write checks to the church, you can combine contributions to several accounts (annual budget, capital campaign, etc.) on a single check as long as you use the memo line to indicate how much goes to each account. This will save you some time and checks and does not make the accounting any harder at my end. Mission & Outreach Special Offering for October is UCC Neighbors in Need

The Neighbors in Need offering, which we will receive through the month of October, supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Through UCCTakeAction.org, our national Justice and Witness Ministries office offers resources, news updates, and action alerts on a broad spectrum of justice issues. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors in the UCC. One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1.000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. To support NIN, write your check out to the church and include "NIN" in the memo line.
