Walking and Running on Faith

Dear Church Family,

If you could help save lives by reducing the number of gun-related deaths in the state of Washington by 16%, would you do it? One can never know for certain what the effect of a law will be, but we do know that states with background checks average 16% fewer deaths caused by guns than states without them. This is why the campaign for background checks on all gun sales in our state is such an important moral issue for us. We have the opportunity to literally keep people from being killed.

For some, the challenge of attempting to change or adopt laws pertaining to guns is cause for despair. Some say the gun lobby is too powerful. They have too much money, and gun manufacturers have too much at stake to let background checks become law. However, I think this view underestimates the lengths to which both people who have lost loved ones to gun violence and people who want to prevent the loss of their loved ones to gun violence are willing to go in order to make sure that more people are not killed. I believe this is an issue in which the power of love will prove to be much stronger than financial greed or political ideology.

Through our annual all-church social action, our congregation has the opportunity to play a leading role in making a difference on this important issue. In January, the legislators in our state will be considering whether to pass a law requiring background checks for all gun sales. If they decline to act (which they most likely will), there will be a voter initiative to make background checks on all gun sales a law. We need to show the legislators and the public that the desire and commitment is there to make this happen. We can do this by running and walking in support of background checks on January 30th.

To show one's support, one can walk as little as a quarter of a mile or run as much as a marathon. There will also be a 5k walk and a 5k run. Everyone will arrive on the front steps of the legislative building in Olympia before a crowd assembled to cheer the finishers. The event will take place as part of the annual advocacy day for the Faith Action Network. To register or to learn more about the event, visit: www.runnersforbackgroundchecks.org.

In the sacred scriptures of Judaism and Christianity, the act of running symbolizes the endurance and stamina that comes with faith. Isaiah says that those who wait on God "shall run and not be weary," while Hebrews asserts, "Let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us." On January 30th, runners and walkers of faith will show the state of Washington that they are willing to go the extra mile to make background checks on all gun sales law in the sate of Washington.

Typhoon Haiyan How To Help

As the most powerful storm ever to make landfall battered the Philippines early Friday morning, <u>United Church of Christ Disaster</u>
<u>Ministries</u> immediately reached out to partners in the country to offer assistance.

"Because we are part of a worldwide fellowship, we know our partners in the Philippines and Asia are already at work responding to meet the needs of survivors," said Susan Sanders, minister for the UCC's Global Sharing of Resources. "Gifts given previously to One Great Hour of Sharing enable the UCC to send financial resources immediately to accompany our prayers."

An estimated 10,000 people have died, and up to 600,000 people are homeless. Those evacuated are taking shelter in churches and other areas in more than 20 provinces. Several churches of the United Church of Christ in the Philippines are serving as shelters.

Report from Book Group by Alona Steinke

Our group chose Bill McKibben's book Eaarth Making a Life on a Tough New Planet. Bill McKibben is the founder of 350.org. He was among the first to warn of the dangers of global warming.

Global warming is already happening. The earth is warming, the Arctic ice caps and Greenland are melting, and species are shrinking. The pH of the oceans is changing, bringing disaster to the shell fish industry and destruction to coral reefs.

Warm air holds more water vapor than cold air. This means increased evaporation and hence drought in arid areas. Once that water is in the atmosphere, it has to come down, which means increased deluge and flood in moist areas.

There is a glimmer of hope. McKibben says that if we work really hard to stop the burning of fossil fuels, and if we stay committed, with luck we may be able to maintain a planet that will sustain some kind of civilization. It won't be the same planet, so it can't be the same civilization.

If we can actually pull it off, McKibben foresees a future where maintenance, rather than growth, is the goal. Both food and energy production will be local and diverse instead of centralized. To that end, our group has committed to growing much of our own food and encouraging others to do so. We want to buy local and what is in season.

We are activists. We show up in force at hearings, where we testify against the transport, export, and burning of fossil fuels. Sometimes we even make a little mischief to get our point across. We don't want to see the Columbia River become a conduit for coal and oil. We are proud to have signed the Planet Earth Pledge, and we invite you to sign as well by going to www.PlanetEarthPledge.org and clicking on the word follow.
