# **Property & Finance Notes**

We are beginning to plan for an exciting 2014 with projects to protect and enhance our facilities. A new roof over the Education Wing, painting and repairs to the outside of the building, new carpet in the lower and upper corridors and a new organ are all possible and planned depending on bids and funding. Also, we are forming a task force to determine what modifications can be made to the outside entrance to the Sanctuary. If you are interested in participating in discussing changes to the entrance please talk with John Greenauer.

Several people have asked for examples of the cost for various projects. We are in the process of determining the timing, scope, soliciting bids and determining the cash available but early bids reveal the following approximations:

> Pastor's Office or any Christian Education room will cost approximately \$1.000.

Modifications to the entrance range from \$100 for a window to \$300 for a skylight.

A replacement organ will cost between \$5-6,000 and we currently have \$4,800 in the organ fund.

The Capital Campaign and designated funds will provide for most of the financing of these projects, but not all. If you would like to make a year-end gift to support a particular project or one year pledge to the Capital Campaign it will help provide funding beyond the pledged Capital Campaign level.

## **Temporary Organ**

On November 2<sup>nd</sup>, our Johannes 3-keyboard electronic organ suffered a failure that rendered it unusable after many years of service in our sanctuary. A small committee had been formed earlier in the year to begin looking into replacing the organ when it suffered another failure that was not yet terminal.

Over several meetings to-date we have been educating ourselves about the current state of elec ke to borrow their rental organ for about six weeks, free of charge. It had just returned from a time in Medford and was going to be idle during this period. Knowing of our situation they offered the instrument as a loaner to help us through the Christmas season and to allow us to experience a modern electronic organ. On December 18<sup>th</sup> Chris Nordwall and Michael Ruppert, partners in RCOB, installed an Allen L227e electronic organ in our sanctuary including twelve speakers and the large subwoofer on the right side of the chancel (for those who are curious, this one-year-old organ would be priced at about \$40,000 for purchase).

We appreciate the loan of this instrument and hope you enjoy the music Christopher brings forth from it while it is in our sanctuary.
