# Art That Will Blow Your Mind!

Dear Church Family,

In the original Greek of the New Testament, the word "repent" can be translated as "to go beyond the mind that we have." Scholar Marcus Borg explains what this definition of repentance entails. Our past experiences socialized us to have a particular way of thinking about the world but through our encounter with God and Jesus we have gained a new way of seeing and understanding life. Because Lent is conceived as a season of repentance, our church is going to begin Lent with an Ash Wednesday art display that will *Blow Your Mind*!

For this art display, we are inviting church members to submit photos that represent how they do not conform to a particular stereotype that others might often have of them. For example, if you look like a tough guy enforcer for the mob but also happen to love kittens, then give us a photo of you snuggling on the sofa with your kitty cat. Or, maybe people think that you are a "gentle, sweet grandma" but you happen to also be one of the world's leading experts on the use of Japanese samurai swords. In that case, we want a picture of you slicing open a watermelon with your biggest sword. Please submit to the main office your photo along with a paragraph explaining the photograph and the stereotype to which you do not conform by Sunday, March 2<sup>nd</sup>.

To correspond with this Lenten art display, our Christian Education Ministry is organizing a Lenten luncheon speaker series with a theme entitled "The Real You." The ministry is asking for people to share a story about themselves that reveals a dimension of one's life that might normally be unknown to others. Maybe people do not know that cultivating bonsai cactuses is your greatest passion in life. We want to hear all about it. Your story does not need to be a long one. We will likely have more than one story each Sunday. Let's make this year's Lent a meaningful and enriching time that will Blow Our Collective Mind with the fresh winds of repentance. I invite you to join with me in making this happen.
