#### **Modern Day Prophets**

Dear Church Family,

Last week a group of us convened to select three books on modern day environmental prophets. In the fall, we will form book groups to read these exciting autobiographical and biographical works. Sign up sheets will be the narthex this summer. Here you will find a summary of each book:

#### Unbowed: A Memoir by Wangari Maathai

Born in a rural Kenyan village in 1940, the Nobel Peace Prize winner Wangari Maathai was already an iconoclast as a child, determined to get an education even though most African girls then were uneducated. This is an inspiring autobiography with many compelling parts. There is the story of her education as she became the first woman both to earn a PhD and to head a university department in Kenya. There is also the story of her numerous run-ins with the brutal government of Daniel arap Moi. Finally, there is the story of her establishing the Green Belt Movement, which helps restore indigenous forests while assisting rural women by paying them to plant trees in their villages.

#### Reason for Hope: A Spiritual Journey by Jane Goodall and Philip Berman

In this book, the world's most famous, and perhaps most beloved, female scientist reveals her inner journey. Goodall, who's 65, covers her entire life here, from her earliest years in England to her years in Gombe, Nigeria where she became the foremost expert in the world on chimpanzees. The book additionally covers her more recent work as an activist for environmental causes and animal rights. The book is viscerally as well as morally thrilling. Goodall has nurtured a fundamental understanding that goodness can prevail with each person's help.

### Rachel Carson and Her Sisters: Extraordinary Women Who Have Shaped America's Environment by Robert Musil

This book redefines the achievements and legacy of environmental pioneer and scientist Rachel Carson by linking her work to a wide network of American women activists and writers. Rachel Carson was the first American to combine two longstanding, but separate strands of American environmentalism—the love of nature and a concern for human health. Widely known for her 1962 best-seller, *Silent Spring*, Carson is today often perceived as a solitary "great woman," whose work single-handedly launched a modern environmental movement. But as Musil demonstrates, Carson's life's work drew upon and was supported by already existing movements, many led by women, in conservation and public health.

## We Read Summer Books 2014 Prophetic Action

Our Prophetic Action task force is recommending two books for your summer reading pleasure. One is a recent best seller, and the other is a classic.

Flight Behavior by Barbara Kingsolver. In what may be the first novel to realistically imagine the near-term impact of "global weirding," Barbara Kingsolver sets her latest story in rural Appalachia. In fictional Feathertown, Tennessee, Dellarobia Turnbow--on the run from her stifling life--charges up the mountain above her husband's family farm and stumbles onto a "valley of fire" filled with millions of monarch butterflies. This vision is deemed miraculous by the town's parishioners, then the international media. But when Ovid. a scientist who studies monarch behavior, sets up a lab on the Turnbow farm, he learns that the butterflies' presence signals systemic disorder--and Dellarobia's inlaws' logging plans won't help. This book gracefully, urgently contributes to the dialogue of survival on this swiftly tilting planet. Available at your local bookstore or Amazon print or Kindle.

Silent Spring by Rachel Carson. This book was first published in September 1962, and the outcry that followed its publication forced the banning of DDT and spurred revolutionary changes in the laws affecting our air, land, and water. Carson's passionate concern for the future of our planet reverberated powerfully throughout the world, and her eloquent book was instrumental in launching the environmental movement. It is without question one of the landmark books of the twentieth century. Available at your local bookstore or Amazon print or Kindle.
