## We Read Summer Books 2014 Prophetic Action

Our Prophetic Action task force is recommending two books for your summer reading pleasure. One is a recent best seller, and the other is a classic.

Flight Behavior by Barbara Kingsolver. In what may be the first novel to realistically imagine the near-term impact of "global weirding," Barbara Kingsolver sets her latest story in rural Appalachia. In fictional Feathertown, Tennessee, Dellarobia Turnbow--on the run from her stifling life--charges up the mountain above her husband's family farm and stumbles onto a "valley of fire" filled with millions of monarch butterflies. This vision is deemed miraculous by the town's parishioners, then the international media. But when Ovid, a scientist who studies monarch behavior, sets up a lab on the Turnbow farm, he learns that the butterflies' presence signals systemic disorder--and Dellarobia's in-laws' logging plans won't help. This book gracefully, urgently contributes to the dialogue of survival on this swiftly tilting planet. Available at your local bookstore or Amazon print or Kindle.

<u>Silent Spring</u> by Rachel Carson. This book was first published in September 1962, and the outcry that followed its publication forced the banning of DDT and spurred revolutionary changes in the laws affecting our air, land, and water. Carson's passionate concern for the future of our planet reverberated powerfully throughout the world, and her eloquent book was instrumental in launching the environmental movement. It is without question one of the landmark books of the twentieth century. Available at your local bookstore or Amazon print or Kindle.

Our church will once again have an informational booth at the event. This is a fun, family friendly day in the park with entertainment, music and plenty of room for picnics with foods chosen from the adjacent Farmer's Market. This is another chance to be a witness in our community for LGBT rights and for equality. Although we are grateful for the freedom to marry in Washington, and now Oregon, there is still much work to be done.



#### From Your Moderator:

One of my goals as church moderator this year is to provide communication to the congregation on what is going on with council, and the ministries and committees. Rather than only informing everyone at congregational meetings or when there are specific issues. I will keep you up to date via articles in The Link.

The Property & Finance committee has been active this spring. The education wing was re-roofed in June, including repair of siding over the entrance to the building. By the time this article is published, the exterior of the building will be prepared for power washing and then painted. A contract has been approved to replace the carpet in the upper and lower hallways, elevator, stairs, classrooms, choir room, Nettie Fries Lounge and the offices. The first phase of carpet replacement will start on July 14. The second phase will begin July 21<sup>st</sup>. All of these projects were made possible with the funds raised by the Capital Campaign. On the horizon, but not funded by capital campaign funds, is the remodeling of the front entrance to the Sanctuary. We have received a donation that will allow for the purchase of windows for the east, south and west side of "shed", moving the entrance to the south side and replace the rock that is currently in place with a hard surface.

The May financial report shows that we are still ahead of budget on income and below budget on expenditures, however that can change, particularly during July and August. As you may remember when the budget was approved, we announced that we would not ask for a supplemental pledge and would operate spending only what we had, and if necessary, we would "borrow" funds from reserve funds. As of this date we have not had to do that, but that doesn't mean that we won't have to at some point this year. Property & Finance will continue to study the budget and look for ways to save expenses and increase building rental use if possible.

Karen Kulm reported for Mission & Outreach, that the church was well represented at Portland Pride. Vancouver Saturday in the Park is on July 12 and the church will have a booth again this year. The Vancouver Peace Fair is on September 13<sup>th</sup>.

Communications will produce two portable A-Frame signs to be used on Sundays. One will be placed at the church entrance and will provide worship starting times and locations for our church and that will include Metropolitan Community Church which meets in in the Plymouth Room. The other will be placed at the intersection of Highway 99 and 68<sup>th</sup> St and will direct people to our church. The committee is also planning to look into a new church website design. Mike King, chairman, said that volunteer input is welcome.

Christian Education reports that Vacation Bible School will be held August 7 & 8. Sunday school Kick-off will be September 7, with the youth participating in the service that day.

Parish Life is planning the church picnic for July 27<sup>th</sup> after worship. The picnic will be held at the Hazel Dell Park, 2300 68<sup>th</sup> St., just east of the church. As has been previously announced, Daryl DeSilva and Marnie Wright are stepping down from the Liturgical Arts committee after many years of dedicated service. Parish Life is looking for two individuals to take on this responsibility.

The Diaconate will have a training session for all of its members for communication, visitations, dealing with loss and how to write cards. They are also re-working the prayer chain.

Membership reports that there are plans for a new member orientation and meeting in the fall.

Brooks will be on vacation the week of July 13 and a study leave the following week. Members of the congregation will conduct the church service on July 13th. On July 20<sup>th</sup> John Boonstra, recently the Pastor at White Salmon UCC and now doing environmental work, will preach.

Brooks and the Stewardship committee will be working on plans for launching the 2015 pledge campaign that will culminate in late November. A task force will be assembled, since the committee only has one member. (Anyone that would like to join this task force is welcome to do so, it isn't too late).

Darrell Brandenburg and Ed Frank are stepping down as coordinators of the Men's Breakfast, so we are looking for someone who will take on the responsibility of finding programs once a month on the third Saturday of every month (except July and August).

The next Council meeting will be July 24<sup>th</sup> at 7:00. I should also remind members that anyone who wishes to attend these meetings is welcome. If you have a particular agenda item that you would like to present to council, just let me know prior to the meeting.
