UCC Response to Crisis of Unaccompanied Minors

We are facing an escalating humanitarian crisis as a growing number of children flee escalating violence in Central America. So far in FY 2014 alone 47,000 children have sought refuge at our borders. It is from dire circumstances that a child chooses to migrate thousands of miles. As people of faith we have an ethical obligation to care for the most vulnerable among us. The root causes of these changing migration patterns are extreme poverty, violence, and rising homicide rates in El Salvador, Honduras and Guatemala, from which most of the children are arriving.

One way to help is by giving. Your financial contribution is multiplied by joining with others to increase the capacity of the UCC to address humanitarian needs and to shape the future to provide food, water, safe places, a listening pastoral ear, religious services, and legal assistance that provides access to the U.S. legal system to tell stories for official documentation. **Donations noting "Unaccompanied Child Refugees"** can be sent to Wider Church Ministries, Financial Services -6th Floor, 700 Prospect Avenue, Cleveland, OH 44115.
