### Church to Host First UCC Social Justice Revival!

Brothers and sisters! A revival is coming to our church! If you've been looking for a spark to ignite your life or if you've been looking for an opportunity to share your fire with someone else, this is your chance! A few months ago my own flame of excitement was lit when I received a phone call from the Rev. Linda Jaramillo. Many of you know her as a former intern at our church, and many of you also know that she is now the Executive Minister of Justice and Witness Ministries for our denomination. When Linda called, she wanted to know if our church would host the first UCC social justice revival ever. UCC churches from throughout the UCC would be invited to attend a revival at our church on Saturday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. To host this denominational event is a tremendous honor, and while a lot of factors led to our being asked to serve as hosts, one of the factors is our own church's reputation for social justice advocacy.

The theme of the revival is "Stoking the Fires of Justice: A Revival for Social Change." The revival will provide a time of inspiring worship, preaching, and training. All of it designed to fan the flames of justice in the Northwest. Our guest preacher for the day will be the Rev. Thea Mateu, who is on the Board of Directors for the UCC and is the Young Adult Ministry Coordinator for the UCC's Southern California-Nevada Conference. Music for the revival will feature the Highland Christian Center Choir, the Ainsworth UCC Choir, and our very own choir!

The hospitality of our members will be a big part of this event's success. We have already formed a task force to organize ourselves for this purpose. Because people will be traveling from places throughout the Northwest, one immediate need is to find members who would be willing to host an out of town guest in their home. # Mission & Outreach Special Offering for October is UCC Neighbors in Need

The Neighbors in Need offering, which we will receive through the month of October, supports the UCC's ministries of justice and compassion throughout the United States. Two-thirds of the offering is used by the UCC's Justice and Witness Ministries to fund a wide array of local and national justice initiatives, advocacy efforts, and direct service projects. Through UCCTakeAction.org, our national Justice and Witness Ministries office offers resources, news updates, and action alerts on a broad spectrum of justice issues. Working with members of the UCC Justice and Peace Action Network (a network of thousands of UCC justice and peace advocates), Justice and Witness continues its strong policy advocacy work on issues such as the federal budget, voting rights, immigration, health care, hate crimes, civil liberties, and environmental justice. Neighbors in Need also supports our American Indian neighbors in the UCC. One-third of the offering supports the UCC's Council for American Indian Ministries (CAIM). Historically, forebears of the UCC established churches and worked with Lakota, Dakota, Nakota, Mandan, Hidatsa, Arickara, and Hocak in North and South Dakota, Wisconsin, and northern Nebraska. Today there are 20 UCC congregations on reservations and one urban, multi-tribal UCC congregation in Minneapolis, Minnesota. These churches and their pastors are supported by CAIM. CAIM is also an invaluable resource for more than 1.000 individuals from dozens of other tribes and nations who are members of other UCC congregations in the U.S. To support NIN, write your check out to the church and include "NIN" in the memo line. ### **Summer Survey Results!**

Many thanks to the fifty of you who took the time to fill out and submit our end of the summer worship survey. Here are the results question by question:

- 53% of respondents indicated that they
  wanted a song leader to guide us from the
  microphone during summer worship, while
  22% said we should do this occasionally in the
  summer and 25% said we should not
  do this at all.
- 40% of respondents indicated that they did not prefer large print bulletins, while 33% said they preferred them permanently and 27% said they preferred them occasionally.
- 54% of respondents indicated that they preferred occasionally beginning our worship service with a focus on gratitude, while 44% said they prefer this.
- 68% of respondents indicated that they
  preferred the permanent inclusion of a silent
  meditation near the end of worship, while 26%
  said they occasionally preferred it and 6% did
  not prefer it.

These results have led our Parish Life Committee to make the following determinations: In the three instances where a clear majority of at least 50 percent of respondents favored a particular direction, we will seek to follow the wishes of the majority in future worship services. With regard to large print bulletins, there was not a clear majority and those who preferred either the occasional use of large print bulletins or the permanent use of such bulletins had a combined total that was notably greater than those who did not prefer such bulletins. As a result, Parish Life approved of using large print color bulletins for no more than 10 Sundays a year. These Sundays would be special occasions such as Palm Sunday, Easter, Pentecost, Advent, Christmas Eve, and Kick Off Sunday.
