Dear Church Family,

On October 26th, we again witnessed the creation of a small island of gently flickering flames in front of our sanctuary as one member after another lit a candle in memory of a loved one who had



died. For the 20th consecutive year, our church gave public expression to some of the deepest sentiments one can hold. Twenty years ago Connie Oppel had brought the idea of an All Saints candle lighting ceremony to the Rev. Farley Maxwell who in turn helped establish it as one of the most meaningful events in the life of our congregation every year.

The enduring traditions of our church have a power. They connect us to what matters most, to what resides at the core of our being. Often, they connect us to deep currents of love that we might have difficulty accessing if it were not for the caring and nurturing community around us.

This recognition made me realize all the more how sacred, how profound, how vital our life together is.

Church Restructure

A proposal to change the governance structure of our church was presented to the Church Council on October 23. More detailed information and more opportunities for suggestions were requested before a vote. Therefore, a summary of the proposal and a Question and Answer document is now available from the church office (electronic or hard copy) and will also be available after the worship service on November 9. In addition. there will be a meeting after the worship service on November 16 for everyone interested in providing suggestions or learning more. Suggestions may be incorporated into the proposal as appropriate. It is expected Council will vote on the proposal November 20 and, if approved, the Congregation will vote on it November 23. The proposal reduces the number of current Ministries and Committees from 12 to 3 and elected positions from 88 to 28. The Ministries are: 1) Finance and Business; 2) Worship and Witness; and 3) Care and Hospitality. If approved, a period to plan for the transition to the new Ministries will occur early in 2015 and the Ministries will take effect on June 1, 2015. Periodic evaluations (and adjustments as practical) are planned during the first year. You are invited to obtain a copy of the written material mentioned above and to attend the meeting after worship on November 16.

Choir's Christmas Cantata

'I Hear the Prophet Callin' by Pepper Choplin is a gathering together of musical flavors: Appalachian, Irish, Latin, Cajun and Early American.
