An Update on our Mortgage and our **Recent Building Improvements**

As home owners, most of us find that our mortgage payments usually include more for interest than for principal. I'm proud to say that after ten months in 2014, while our mortgage interest payments were \$24,074, our total principal reduction was \$32,074 --\$5,000 from our operating budget and \$27,074 from our Capital Campaign! We still owe about \$559,258 (down from a total amount owed after the sanctuary improvements of about \$970,000).

We have also paid out over \$48,900 for improvements to our building and parking lot through our capital campaign funds: repairing and re-striping the parking lot, re-roofing the education wing, replacing the flooring in the Plymouth Room and replacing carpet. (Note: the recent upgrade to our sanctuary entrance was entirely funded by donations made for that purpose, outside the capital campaign).

After all of this work, our capital campaign balance is nearly depleted. Please be sure to make you capital campaign pledge payments! If you are not currently pledging to the capital campaign, but you are pleased with the recent improvements to our building, your contributions to help pay for this effort would be greatly appreciated. Please put "capital fund" in the memo line on your check.

During the cold winter months their need for shelter is even more important, so in 2003, the Council for the Homeless and SHARE partnered with the Greater Vancouver Interfaith Association to create the Winter Hospitality Overflow (WHO), a program committed to providing safe shelter during the winter months.

Our church volunteers at the men's shelter located at the St. Paul Lutheran church in downtown Vancouver. The WHO guests are offered not only a warm place to sleep, but a hot shower, meal, and the welcome and warmth of a caring community working to address the most basic of human needs.

Although our church volunteer week is March 1-7, **you can help now** by donating men's socks, gloves, hats, thermals, and underwear. Just place your items in the big yellow basket in the narthex.
